Objectives and Investment Policy

The objective and investment policy of the Fund aims to deliver capital returns in excess of the FTSE 350 index with lower volatility over a market cycle, as well as annual yield above the same index, primarily through investment in UK companies listed on a global stock market. Equity exposure may be obtained through equity and equity linked securities including shares, depositary receipts, warrants and other participation rights, convertible securities, index and participation notes and equity linked notes.

Despite the emphasis on UK equities, the Fund may at times hold significant levels of cash to manage volatility or to protect the fund from stock market corrections. In seeking to generate additional income, the Fund may also sell call and put options with respect to particular securities or positions held by the Fund. Its flexibility, value driven style and yield enhancement strategy mean that the total return of the Fund may periodically diverge significantly from that of the FTSE 350.

The Fund is a UCITS scheme as defined for the purposes of the FCA's Collective Investment Schemes Sourcebook as amended (the "Rules") and aims to invest primarily in equity securities, but in pursuing its objective it may also invest in other asset classes specified by the Rules and within the limits of the investment and borrowing powers prescribed by the Rules and the Fund's Prospectus.

The base currency of the Fund is pounds sterling.

Income arising from the Fund is distributed to the holders of income units. Investors can buy and sell units on demand when the scheme prices daily at 10.30 pm.


