

MELLON EDUCATE, LONDON

The Stonehage Fleming Charitable Foundation donated to the cause of the development of the recently completed Building Blitz in Mfuleni Township near Cape Town.

This <u>Mellon Educate</u> project targets the improvement of facilities at two schools and an orphanage. It is expected that over 2,800 children will be lifted to better learning in more beneficial surroundings as a result of the work completed.

On Mandela Day, the Johannesburg office collected educational toys and donated gift vouchers to the Princess Alice Adoption home. They also spent the afternoon with the children.

The <u>Princess Alice Adoption Home</u> is a temporary place of safety, which provides 24-hour residential care to babies who have been consented for adoption, abandoned or removed

from family care.

NORVAL FOUNDATION, SOUTH AFRICA

On the 5th November this year, SF clients and their children spent the afternoon at the <u>Norval Foundation</u>, together with children from the Westlake Community. Westlake is a poor community and we hosted children from two nursery schools for the afternoon, Sunbeam Early Childhood Development Centre and Little Squirrels.

The Norval family are the founders and initial funders of the Norval Foundation. Their aim is to make art widely accessible



to local and international visitors by creating a self-sustaining centre for art. The proceeds from capital donations will be used to secure the foundation for future generations.



WORLD IBD DAY, JERSEY

Huge congratulations to all those who helped raise awareness of IBD, through contributing towards Jessie Gallay's sponsored sky dive. Jessie was diagnosed with Colitis at 15 and after a severe illness went through life-changing and life-saving surgery last year. At only 19, she is one of the youngest people ever to have to go through this. Through personal donations and dress down collections, Stonehage Fleming staff helped Jessie raise £3,372.

<u>World IBD Day</u> takes place on 19 May each year and unites people worldwide in their fight against Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis, known as inflammatory bowel diseases.

DRAGON BOAT RACE, JERSEY

Congratulations to the 'Rowing Stones' who participated in the 22nd year of the Jersey Hospice Dragon Boat Race, and the race attracts around 50 Teams each year and this year £200 was raised by Stonehage Fleming.

The <u>Jersey Hospice Care</u> has been operating since 1982 and supports over a 1000 patients a year with over 450 people volunteering their time each year.

<u>The Haven Night Shelter</u> – Stonehage Fleming staff in Cape Town cleaning aids, cups and cutlery, for 'The Haven Night Shelter', which is a homeless shelter. Stonehage Fleming also bought vouchers from the homeless shelter and then redistributed among staff. Staff could give the vouchers to homeless people in the street and the voucher provides food and shelter for a night.

The Haven Night Shelter was established in 1978 in Cape Town, South Africa. With the aim to collaborate and cooperate with religious institutions, organisations, welfare bodies, service providers, businesses, government departments, local authorities and individuals concerned with the care and welfare of the destitute

<u>Centrepoint</u> – London staff members attended a fundraising dinner for Centrepoint's 50th Anniversary. The London Office has supported the charity over a numbers of years in its provision of accommodation and support to homeless and disadvantaged young people across the UK.

Centrepoint provides housing and support for young people in London, Manchester, Yorkshire and the North East and through partnerships all over the UK. They aim to give homeless young people a future and we want to end youth homelessness.

<u>Envision</u> – Eight members of the London Office have been volunteering with local schoolchildren as business mentors as they work on projects to raise awareness on, and tackle, current issues in the community. We continue to support the charity both through staff volunteers and from generous donations from our Next Generation attendees.

The programme sets young people aged 15-16 the challenge of building an awareness campaign for a cause of their choice. Along the way, the young people complete pitching challenges to develop their confidence, communication and teamwork - essential skills for later life.
